Concept:

Alpine development is more and more characterized by a rising number of potential negotiating parties; by growing information needs regarding administrative, economic and political contexts and developments; by an increasing complexity of the economic and political contexts and developments and by growing coordination needs. On this account, the following challenges or needs for future landscape processes can be identified: a) regional negotiation capabilities, b) networking activities c) information flow and processing d) improvement of organisational knowledge (Pfefferkorn et. al 2006). The workshop will focus on reflecting this situation and discussing best praxis examples in landscape development negotiations processes.
